June Program - Sara Ayers-Rigsby & The Everglades

June's presentation will be a lecture entitled "How the Everglades Was Made."

Sara Ayers-Rigsby from the Florida Public Archeology Network will be speaking. FPAN is hosted by the Anthropology Department at FAU which also runs archaeological projects in Ecuador and Nicaragua as well as doing ground breaking research in primatology. Sara Ayers-Rigsby specializes in cultural resources management and historic preservation.

Prior to beginning her role as Southeast/Southwest Regional Director, she spent 10 years working as an archaeologist throughout the United States, with a regional focus on the archaeology of the southeast and Mid Atlantic. Her research interests include public outreach and archaeology, archaeological compliance legislation and industrial archaeology in Florida. She loves visiting state parks, historical sites, and house museums in south Florida and is always thrilled to talk to others about them!

June Birthstones

Pearl

Unlike most gemstones that are found within the Earth, pearls have an organic origin. They are created inside the shells of certain species of oysters and clams. Pearls were also widely used as medicine in Europe until the 17th century. Arabs and Persians believed it was a cure for various kinds of diseases, including insanity. Pearls have also been used as medicine as early as 2000 BC in China, where they were believed to represent wealth, power and longevity.

<u>Alexandrite</u>

Alexandrite possesses an enchanting chameleonlike personality. In daylight, it appears as a beautiful green, sometimes with a bluish cast or a brownish tint. However, under artificial lighting, the stone turns reddish-violet or violet. Alexandrite is an uncommon stone, and therefore very expensive. Sri Lanka is the main source of alexandrite today. In Russia, the stone is popular because it reflects the Russian national colors, green and red, and is believed to bring good luck. *Earthsky.org* **Bench** Tips!




